An Update from the missions we support in Moldava:

Dear Andrew Just before myself sinking in the salvage of correspondence I decided to send you a message. I am so grateful to Providence I can share with you not only joy, but the grief and loss as well. Albeit for decades my country and it's people are loosing it's economical, social and political connections to Russia (these were almost destroyed by the war in Ukraine), our cultural links are still strong and Moldavian diaspora in Russia still numerous. After Alexey Navalny death myself and my parents discovered each of us personally was inspired by his life, his ideas, his public speeches. In ex-Soviet families is still kind of a taboo to discuss political issues. But we were on the same line for years. It is so sad. Like the house is empty. He was a real fireproof man. As far as I know he was an active Christian and spoke overtly against the Russian Orthodox Church authorities (which supported the war in Ukraine). There is a place near Russian embassy protesters use for years and a lot of Moldovans brought flowers to this spontaneous Navalny memorial. I was there too and while leaving the place I recalled a Biblical verse: "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, the one who kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to her! How often I wanted to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, but you were not willing! See! Your house is left to you desolate; for I say to you, you shall see Me no more till you say, 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord!""

In light of the above and other Scriptures, the Well Church has decided to offer a Service of Prayer and Healing. This Service will be in addition to the Sunday morning worship. It will be a liturgy of prayer, music, exhortation, and Communion to experience the healing power of God in our congregation and beyond.
